End-of-year financials will be shared with the membership via our website so stay tuned for further information. As of 07/01/16, the society has about \$1,807.77 in all of our checking accounts and \$24,104.78 in all of our savings accounts for a total of \$25,912.55 so every new membership, renewed membership, book or item sold, or unrestricted donation really counts. Please remember that all non-Lifetime membership renewals for 2016 were due in February 2016 so if not renewed, then you may be dropped from the membership list and mailings. A 990-N IRS filing and State of Ohio yearly filing were completed and submitted along with the biannual Ohio Sales Tax filing. We currently have 12 non-renewed members and 56 paid members.
