The ground hog situation underneath the "L" section has gotten worse, but we hope that our home remedies have driven it away. The sump pump area has been dug out and made larger and deeper with a new plastic insert. We hope that this will help to alleviate the standing water issue that the museum has had in the past in the basement. A broken glass door on a display case has been replaced with new glass by Ken Roth. We will keep you updated as more items are completed.

End-of-year financials will be shared with the membership via our website so stay tuned for further information. As of 11/01/15, the society has about \$4,716.42 in all of our checking accounts and \$24,101.32 in all of our savings accounts for a total of \$28,817.74 so every new membership, renewed membership, book or item sold, or unrestricted donation really counts. The society made \$50.00 in raffle sales and \$57.00 in promotional items at the 2015 Columbia Block House Day on 09/12/15, and \$192.00 in raffle sales and \$60.00 in promotional items along with \$768.00 in gross ticket sales at the Tea Fundraising Event on 10/18/15. The society also received several cash and in-kind donations for both events. Please remember that all non-Lifetime membership renewals are due for 2016 in February 2016. Excerpt from We Remember Stories of Columbia Township (Volume 3) Book

"School Days of Yore: Legends and Realities"

Columbia was fortunate in having its roots planted firmly in the New England belief that a good education was fundamentally important to both an individual's and a community's wellbeing. In The Williams Brothers History of Lorain County, published in 1879, we are told that when the settlers arrived in 1807, "the first school was opened [in 1808] by Mrs. Sally Bronson, in her own home," and that "the number of her scholars was ten." Then in "the following winter her husband, Bela Bronson, taught a school in Lemuel Hoadley's blacksmith shop." It is significant that in this history, written seventy-one years after Columbia's founding, education is mentioned in conjunction with Sally Bronson, Columbia's "first lady," as it shows equally the reverence in which both Sally and education were held in the township, but it also feeds the notion, which persists to the present day, that Columbia pioneers were superior beings filled with a true and mighty zeal for learning. Well, some of them were.
